NEWS FROM THE BRITISH REGIONAL FURNITURE STUDY CENTRE

Staffing at the Centre has been further strengthened by the appointment of Clare Conybeare MA FMA as the Centre's Researcher/Archivist. Clare will work under the direction of Dr B Cotton and her post is funded by grants to the Centre from the J Paul Getty Jr Charitable Trust and the Pilgrim Trust.

Clare's prime task is to establish a digital archive related to vernacular furniture and her arrival at the Centre coincided with a generous gift from **Ivan Sparkes** of over seven hundred articles and pamphlets which he has gathered together over the years, while compiling the bibliographies which are published from time to time in *Regional Furniture*. Clare is presently developing a database founded on the Sparkes Archive, a database of the Cotton Collection of regional chairs and a vocabulary of terms used in the description of regional chairs and furniture.

The Centre's archive has also been enhanced by a further gift of books and catalogues from **Ivan Sparkes**, by a set of catalogues of the firm of Josiah Parkes & Sons, donated by the **Lock Museum** and by a gift from **David Sayer** of a booklet about the Gane family of furniture makers.

The Centre's collection of regional furniture has been further increased by a the generous gift from Gill Meddings and Keith Pinn of a pine and birch Scottish Cradle, grained to simulate oak and dating to about 1870 and of a mid 19th Century rush-seated spindle back chair from Lincolnshire.

The Centre is actively seeking to recruit more volunteers to help with its work.
