

# Medieval chests in Kent

In the Spring 2017 issue of the Newsletter Chris Pickvance published a summary of the results of the dendro dates he had obtained for medieval chests in Kent. This work was supported by an RFS bursary and grants from the Marc Fitch Fund, Kent Archaeological Society and the Furniture History Society.
